While connections will be made between sessions, each is stand alone: you are encouraged to come to drop in as your schedule allows.



Reunion

One year ago, the state of Florida paid to fly 49 migrants from Texas to Martha's Vineyard. They had not much more than what they were wearing: no place to stay, without food and not really certain where they had been sent.

Immediately after they landed, Father Chip Seadale of St. Andrew's Episcopal church in Edgartown said, "If they don't have anywhere to stay, let's just put them up in the church". Many of them did stay there for a few days, after which most traveled to other parts of Massachusetts and also to New York, Washington and Michigan.

This past weekend a reunion of the immigrants who were welcomed to the




island and those who accompanied them during their brief stay on the island was held. It was a wonderful celebration, a reconnection after not having seen each other since they left the island. So much had changed in the lives of the immigrants - mostly Venezuelans. Four have remained on island and have found work; the rest are establishing lives elsewhere.

As a part of the celebration, the traveling exhibit *Stories from the Southern Border*, which now has been traveling for much of the past year, was invited to be a part of the reunion. In addition to the exhibit, Rolf Larson led a discussion on immigration and what is involved in accompanying immigrants within the immigration system in our country. It was an honor to be present with this community of old and new neighbors.
