Housing Justice Rally | On Sunday afternoon, March 3, fifteen people rode the bus from CLC to the Islamic Society of Boston building in Roxbury to join more than 1600 people supporting Housing Justice. Included in this group were Beth Castro, Juliet Seaberg, Lisa Chan, and David Ripp.

The gathering organized by GBIO (Greater Boston Interfaith Organization) included folks from Protestant, Catholic, Jewish and Muslim backgrounds.

The purpose of the rally was to show the broad spread support for affordable housing to Massachusetts legislators, 4 of whom attended (2 senators and 2 representatives). Three initiatives which are already in the governor's proposed budget were put forward.

- 1. Adequately fund the maintenance of the 1,131 units of public housing, many of which sit empty due to gross underfunding.
- 2. Guarantee IDs to people coming out of prison, and increase rental certificates for these citizens.
- 3. Give our communities the choice to locally pass real estate transfer fees to raise funding for affordable housing.

We came, we learned, we rejoiced!
